School Ski COVID-19 Safety Plan

1.0 Background

A COVID-19 safety plan is required before school groups can resume field trips to CNSC to ensure everyone's health and safety.

The virus that causes COVID-19 spreads in several ways. It can spread in droplets when a person coughs or sneezes. It can also spread if you touch a contaminated surface and then touch your face. The risk of person-to-person transmission increases the closer you come to other people, the more time you spend near them, and the more people you come near. The risk of surface transmission increases when many people contact the same surface and when those contacts happen over short periods of time.

2.0 Purpose

To create and implement a safety plan that reduces the risk of person-toperson transmission in a group program setting against identified risks through controls that follow the guidelines and direction established by Health Authorities, school authorities, and recommendations from governing sport associations for Return to Sport with the intent to continue to host school groups to empower youth through sport and play.

3.0 Scope

This policy applies to all persons who participate in the School Ski Program at the Caledonia Nordic Ski Club including school registrants and staff/volunteers, CNSC coaches, CNSC volunteers, and CNSC staff.

4.0 Safety Plan

In order to ensure health and safety of persons participating in group programs at Caledonia Nordic Ski Club, the following safe guards and procedures are to be followed:

4.1 Facility

<u>Facility protocols</u>¹ have been developed including the Lodge, Biathlon Range, Biathlon Technical Building, Cross Country Technical Building, Trails, Agility Park, and trails. It is the responsibility of users to read, understand, and follow the developed policy for each space.

4.2 Participation

To participate in School Ski lessons, you are required to:

- Consider your own risk; limit or avoid participation if you are at higher risk of experiencing serious illness from COVID-19;
- Compete the <u>online self-assessment tool</u>², before arrival;
- Stay home if you do not feel well or are displaying symptoms of COVID-19;

- Self-isolate for a minimum of 14 days if you have travelled outside of Canada;
- Stay home if you live in a household with someone who has COVID-19 or shows symptoms of COVID-19;
- Cleanse your hands with soap and water, or hand sanitizer before participation, and frequently throughout;
- Cough into your sleeve;
- Avoid toughing your face;
- Bring your own mask;
- Comply with physical distancing measures at all times as set by the Health Authority. Current minimum distance of 3 meters is required and masks are to be used when 3 meters cannot be maintained;
- Avoid physical contact with others.

4.3 Lessons

Further to 4.2 Participation:

- Groups are to be organized either into cohorts established by School District 57, or by private residence;
- Only one school group will be visiting CNSC per day;
- Schools are to be 2 weeks absent of an in school positive COVID case prior to participation;
- Stay outdoors as much as possible.

4.4 First Aid

In the event that first aid is required to be administered during an activity, all persons attending to the injured individual must first put on a mask and gloves.

4.5 Outbreak Plan

If any individual reports they are suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19 and have been at the workplace/activity place, they MUST inform the coach. The coach will inform the School Ski Coordinator, who informs the General Manager, who informs the President. They will then execute the Outbreak Plan (pg 29)³ provided by viaSport BC.

5.0 Responsibility

Lesson Registrants

- Read and understand the School Ski COVID 19 Safety policy;
- Sign the participant agreement acknowledging acceptance of the risks at registration;
- Inform the coach if you have any health and safety concerns;
- Follow the <u>mask mandate order</u>⁴, the <u>proper use of masks</u> guidelines⁵, and understand the <u>risks and benefits of mask types</u>⁶;
- Inform the person in charge, i.e. coach, if you start to feel mildly ill
 while participating, sanitize your hands, go straight home, and
 complete the online self-assessment tool. If severely ill (e.g.
 difficulty breathing, chest pain) have the person call 911 (and that
 person should ensure the cleaning and disinfecting of any surfaces
 that you have come into contact with).

- School Ski Coordinator consults schools on an individual level to determine comfort level of program resumption and appropriate steps required to mitigate risks;
- School Ski Coordinator trains and provides resources to CNSC coaches to ensure their safety, and the safety of all participants during programs;
- Ensure Program Registrants, Coaches and Volunteers have read and understood the COVID – Safety Plan for School Ski and CANSI Lessons policy and have signed acknowledgement;
- Coaches are to conduct a safety session to remind all registrants of the COVID – Safety Plan for School Ski and CANSI Lessons policy, recording all who attended;
- Coaches follow the <u>mask mandate order</u>⁷, have trained themselves on the <u>proper use of masks</u>⁸ and understood the <u>risks and benefits</u> of mask types⁹;
- Maintain a record of participants at each session;
- Ensure group size does not exceed the Health Authorities maximum limit and falls within the Return to Sport recommended group sizes;
- Follow CNSC facility COVID-19 safety plans;

- Ensure items are not shared. Where sharing of items cannot be avoided (i.e. surfaces), the shared item must be cleaned/disinfected between users. One individual should be assigned to read the information on <u>cleaning and disinfectants</u>¹⁰ and be assigned the tasks of disinfecting;
- Areas of congregation of school groups used for gathering, leaving backpacks, and eating lunch will be cleaned and sanitized before and after school groups leave;
- Clean high touch surfaces (door handles, etc.) and washrooms used by school groups at regular intervals;
- Coaches should ensure adequate supervision so that rules are followed, with reminders as needed.

General Manager

- Conduct a safety meeting with staff to ensure understanding on how to follow these safe practices;
- Ensure staff understand and follow this work safe practice;
- Sanitation supplies are available as needed;
- Masks and gloves are available in case first-aid is required;
- Coach staff are certified in First Aid;
- The safety plan is published to the public and communicated to staff.
